SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION

Approve a resolution authorizing the City to enter into a Local Agency Funding Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for the Clay Street Shared Use Path Project.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution authorizes the City to enter into a funding agreement with IDOT for federal participation in the construction of a Clay Street Shared Use Path Project, including future maintenance of the improvements.

BACKGROUND

The City was awarded Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Funding for this project for this project in the amount \$1,208,000, or 80% of the total project, divided up among phases as follows:

- Preliminary Engineering: \$144,000
- ROW Acquisition: \$40,000
- Construction Engineering: \$100,000
- Construction: \$924,000

This Local Public Agency Funding Agreement is for preliminary engineering, which is estimated to be \$185,290. This will be paid for utilizing \$144,000 of the CMAQ grant funding and \$41,290 of City funds.

This project consists of constructing a shared use path along the north side of Clay Street and decorative lighting to match existing lighting along Clay Street, from North Morrison Avenue to Summit Avenue.

Execution of a funding agreement is required for the City to utilize the awarded federal funds.

The preliminary engineering for this contract was awarded to Oates and Associates on March 10, 2026.
