AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COLLINSVILLE
DESIGNATING THE POSTING OF STOP SIGNS ON CLAY STREET
AT ITS INTERSECTION WITH SUMMIT AVENUE

WHEREAS, the City of Collinsville, Madison and St. Clair Counties, Illinois (the “City”), is a home rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, as such, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare to install stop signs upon certain streets within the corporate limits;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by 625 ILCS 5/11-302 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, the City is authorized to determine and declare by ordinance the location of stop signs upon streets under its jurisdiction based on an engineering and traffic investigation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLINSVILLE, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Posting of Stop Signs. The Collinsville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to establish and designate the installation and posting of two stop signs along Clay Street at its intersection with Summit Avenue in the City of Collinsville, Illinois.

SECTION 2: Effective Date. In accordance with 625 ILCS 5/11-302, the location of the installation of the stop signs established herein shall become effective only when the appropriate stop signs are installed as directed along the designated street.

SECTION 3: In the event any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, in whole or in part, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance, other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 4: All ordinances, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 5: Nothing contained herein shall in any manner be deemed or construed to alter, modify, supersede, supplant or otherwise nullify any other ordinance of the City or the requirements thereof whether or not relating to or in any manner connected with the subject matter hereof, unless expressly set forth herein.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance is effective upon its passage by the City Council, approval by the Mayor, and publication according to law.
